Tim Hudak Outlines Vision for Stronger Ontario with Road Builders Association

TORONTO – Today, Ontario PC Leader Tim Hudak addressed the Ontario Road Builders Association to share three ways a future PC government will move Ontario forward.

First, a PC government will put its faith in the private sector to be Ontario's engine of job creation and economic development – not bigger and more expensive government. Second, the Ontario PCs will deliver a long-term infrastructure plan to ensure stable and predictable funding for construction projects because good transportation systems and roads are critical to creating new jobs and a stronger economy. Third, the Ontario PCs will deliver relief for average hard working Ontario families, seniors and small business owners who are seeing their bills go through the roof under Dalton McGuinty.

In the next provincial election, Ontario will have a clear choice between Dalton McGuinty, who is out of touch with the priorities of Ontario families and businesses, and Tim Hudak and the Ontario PCs, who will put families first and make private-sector job creation a priority.

- The Ontario PCs have committed to investing in the Mid Pen and extending Highway 407 to Highway 35/115. These investments will help create jobs, reduce gridlock and help families spend more time together, rather than be stuck in traffic.
